Focus on LGBTIQ+ Seniors: Information and Inspiration for more Inclusion

On 25 and 26 April 2019 the Rainbow Cities Network, the City of Amsterdam and Pink50+ (Roze50+), in collaboration with IHLIA LGBT Heritage, will host the European conference *Focus on LGBTIQ+ Seniors: Information and Inspiration for more Inclusion* in Amsterdam. You are cordially invited!

This two day conference *Focus on LGBTIQ+ Seniors* is all about exchanging knowledge and experiences in the field of LGBTIQ+ Seniors Europe-wide.

The main topic is the inclusion of LGBTIQ+ seniors, with respect to:

- inclusive services for LGBTIQ+ seniors;
- (prevention of) loneliness and isolation;
- connecting young and old people within the LGBTIQ+ community;
- the role of the government concerning all these issues.

Provisional programme

Thursday 25 April there will be a practice oriented programme offering a lot of activities and good practices all around Amsterdam in which you can participate. You can visit and participate in one or more events of your choice.

Friday 26 April the Conference *Focus on LGBTIQ+ Seniors* is held. In addition to 3 plenary sessions hosted by prominent researchers from the United Kingdom and the Netherlands, there will be 8 interactive workshops, 14 inspirational sessions, 3 presentations, an information market and some surprising interludes.

Saturday 27 April is National King's Day in The Netherlands. This is a national festive holiday to celebrate the birthday of King Willem Alexander. This day there will be events, happenings, free markets and performances throughout Amsterdam. With over 700.000 visitors Amsterdam offers you a very good reason to stay an extra day!

For whom?

All European organisations, projects, professionals and volunteers - nationally, regionally and locally operating - who work with and for LGBTIQ+ senior citizens are invited to participate. About 150 participants are expected to visit the Conference. The official language is English. Participation is free.



About the location

On **Thursday 25 April** there will be about 10 events with, by and for LGBTIQ+ seniors, all around Amsterdam. All locations are centrally situated and very accessible by public transport. The programme leaflet (which appears in March) will contain more information on these events and their precise locations.

The programme offers 3 plenary presentations by renowned researchers from the United Kingdom and the Netherlands. To your choice you can attend interactive workshops about good practices on inclusive services for LGBTIQ+ seniors, (prevention of) loneliness and isolation, connecting young and old people within the LGBTIQ+ community and the role of the government concerning these issues.
